In a recent monthly report to the Board, Chaplain Dave wrote:

The events of the last couple of weeks have brought home to me how short and fragile and precious life is. Chaplain Craig and I attended the funeral services of Marie, a 30 year old woman that worked at a local hotel as a check-in clerk. Her life was short yet it impacted so many individuals as we heard from those that spoke at the service. Or the 22 year old man who was returning home from work on Rt. 944 when a tree limb fell through his windshield striking him in the chest killing him. Each of us has but a short time on this earth. I am reminded of James 4:14, "Whereas ye know not what (shall be) on the morrow. For what (is) your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away." And as we walk by God's grace, I think of Psalm 90:12, "So teach (us) to number our days, that we may apply (our) hearts unto wisdom." But, even though our days, yes even our minutes are numbered on this earth, we have the promise as stated in John 10:28, "And I give onto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any (man) pluck them out of my hand."

If nothing else, this brings to the forefront the need for each of us to share the Word of God with those that we come in contact with; to at least give them an opportunity to hear of God's grace and mercy through His Son, Jesus Christ.

Life on this earth is short - In the words of Charles Thomas Studd:

"Two little lines I heard one day, Traveling along life's busy way; Bringing conviction to my heart, And from my mind would not depart; Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.

Give me Father, a purpose deep, In joy or sorrow Thy word to keep; Faithful and true what e'er the strife, Pleasing Thee in my daily life; Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last."

Perhaps it is because life is so short that we plan out our days, weeks and months. But we are told in Proverbs 16:9 that, "The mind of man plans his way, But the Lord directs his steps." (NASB) This is what Chaplain Craig speaks about in one of his reports:

Matthew 6:3: "Take therefore no thought for the morrow; for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself."

The Scriptures remind me that we never know what tomorrow may hold. Every day we seem to encounter different obstacles and challenges here at the Carlisle Truck Stop Ministry. While the interns (students from Wesley Seminary) were with us, I think they saw all the different areas of ministry that we may run into in a week's time. There have been days where I felt like I had the day planned out when all of a sudden, a phone call would change everything. This reminds me that God knows just what we need and just when we need it. He is always there for us and brings good out of every situation.

The Lord continues to bless us through our chaplains and through you who prayerfully and financially support this Ministry. We finished our fiscal year at the end of June with our expenses being about \$5,000.00 over our income, but as Chaplain Craig said, the Lord always knows just what we need, when we need it, and is He is faithful to provide it. We continually praise Him for supplying all of our needs.

On August 5<sup>th</sup>, we plan to have a Driver Appreciation Day. With use of the pavilion at Petro and donations from several local businesses, we will be providing hamburgers, hotdogs, sodas and all the fixin's free of charge to anyone who stops by. It's just another way to show our appreciation for the drivers and to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way.

Enclosed is a flier for our fall fundraising dinner concert at Fairview Church of the Brethren in York. We will have our usual (but exciting) silent auction, a wonderful 'home-cooked' meal and a concert featuring the southern gospel group "Harmony."
